The Department of Oncology (<https://www.schulich.uwo.ca/oncology/>), Division of Radiation Oncology, Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry at the University of Western Ontario, and its affiliated clinical London Regional Cancer Program, London Health Sciences Centre, are seeking two **Radiation Oncologists** for a full-time clinical academic appointment to the University of Western Ontario. Rank (Assistant, Associate or Full Professor) and appointment status (limited term or continuing) will be determined by experience and qualifications at the time of appointment.

Successful applicants should be certified or eligible for certification in Radiation Oncology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada or equivalent. Candidates must have an MD or equivalent and must be eligible for licensure in the province of Ontario. The successful candidates are expected to develop an active academic practice and research program. A Clinical Fellowship and clinical/research experience would be desirable. The London Regional Cancer Program provides state-of-the-art radiation therapy services that include 9 modern radiation therapy machines (including a TomoTherapy unit), HDR and LDR brachytherapy, and access to CT, MRI, and PET-CT for treatment planning and monitoring. The Radiation Treatment Program provides high quality, innovative radiation treatment services and supports a strong academic Radiation Oncology Division with active research and training programs in Radiation Oncology, Therapy and Medical Physics. The Division currently has 20 staff Radiation Oncologists.

Compensation will be based on qualifications and experience; and composed primarily of the alternate funding plan and academic support.

The highest priority needs for the Division of Radiation Oncology at this time include the **Breast, Head & Neck, Pediatrics, Sarcoma and Skin** disease sites, however, flexibility exists regarding the disease site focus assigned.
