Position

Fellowship in Brachytherapy, Translational and/or Clinical Research

Background:

The Verspeeten Family Cancer Centre at the London Health Sciences Centre serves as the tertiary oncology care centre for Southwestern Ontario, with a catchment area of over 1.5 million people. The Division of Radiation Oncology is at the forefront in brachytherapy to pelvic tumours. Our team includes clinician scientists, medical physics researchers, clinical trials team, trainees, strong collaboration with imaging scientists, all supporting our radiation oncology research program.

Objectives:

- (1) Conduct one or more research projects and/or comparative effectiveness studies in prostate and/or gynecologic brachytherapy
- (2) Gain experience in conducting clinical trials and/or leading translational research in the brachytherapy space. This could include design of a specific clinical trial or a translational project led by the fellow.
- (3) Become proficient in prostate and/or gynecologic brachytherapy

Specific opportunities include:

- Research translational efforts evaluating incorporation of new technologies in brachytherapy
- Systematic reviews of the literature, individual-patient data meta-analyses, and other comparative effectiveness research, with the support of a biostatistician and a library scientist.

Secondary analyses using prospectively collected data from completed trials (e.g. HOPE, PRIAPUS, HEROICC trials), and participation in ongoing trials involving brachytherapy



Time Allotment:

- ♦ 50% clinical experience and direct patient care. Fellowship/staff pairings will be based on the clinical interests and research interests of the fellow, and can include SBRT and/or SRS at any body site.
- ♦ 50% conduct and implementation of specific research projects

Application Procedure

One fellowship position is available for the Academic year July 1, 2025 to June 30, 2026. Applications are invited from physicians who hold a Fellowship of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada or equivalent training, and be licensed with, or be eligible for an educational license from, the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.
